Call to Order

Meeting called to order at 6:00 p.m. in the A. Terry Weathers Board Room at the Howitt Middle School by Mr. Goldberg, President of the Board of Education.

Pledge of Allegiance

Board President Michael Goldberg welcomed those present and announced that the Board of Education was interested in encouraging all members of the public to share their ideas, comments and questions. He noted that public participation opportunities would be available at the beginning of the meeting and again at the end of the meeting and, as stated in Board Policy, no person should speak for more than three minutes and each period of public participation would be limited to thirty minutes. If there were questions or concerns regarding matters on the Consent Agenda, it would be important to utilize the first public participation opportunity as the Board would act on those items immediately.

Mr. Goldberg pointed out the emergency exit. The public session began with the Pledge of Allegiance.

## **Superintendent's Update**

Northside and Districtwide State Plan Superintendent of Schools Paul Defendini introduced Dr. Jennifer Olsen, Assistant to the Superintendent for Elementary Education, stating that she would provide an update to the Board of Education regarding the work she, Dr. Ripley and Principal Michael Febrarro had initiated related to the School Comprehensive Education and District Comprehensive Improvement Plans. Dr. Olsen began with a review of the timeline since the district was first notified of Northside's designation as a CSI school. They, along with a Nassau BOCES consultant and New York State Education Department representatives, worked with students, parents, staff and administrators to review the data provided by the state and to develop a plan of action. Representatives from the New York State Education Department provided a summary of school successes that should be used as a foundation towards continued improvement. Instructional, procedural and cultural improvement plans were designed. Dr. Olsen reviewed the six tenets of improvement for both the SCEP and DCIP plan of action for both Northside and for Grade 6 of the Howitt Middle School.

Preparations for the Start of School

Superintendent of Schools Paul Defendini reported on Summer 2019. He talked about the Extended School Year elementary program at Albany Avenue School and the Literacy program at Saltzman East Memorial. Mr. Defendini thanked and congratulated the staff in the Districtwide Operations Department for their exhaustive work in getting the buildings ready for the opening of school Renovation work at the learning labs at the high school continue. On the curricular side, summer curriculum writing projects have been underway as teachers prepare for the 2019-2020 school year.

Update on the Athletic Complex and the Aquatic Center Assistant to the Superintendent for Business Michael Motisi provided an update on the Athletic Complex and Aquatic Center. Ninety-five percent of the field work is complete; at this point in time, punch list items are being addressed. As to the Aquatic Center, bid openings are currently being scheduled. Mr. Motisi also talked about HVAC and bathroom work. Board of Education summer walk-through tours will take place on August 30.

Update on the Summer 2019 Construction Projects Assistant Superintendent for Innovation and Organizational Development William Brennan provided an update on the work associated with the Smart School Investment Plan. The approved spending plan is at the State Education Department for approval. Dr. Brennan spoke about the renovations in the high school classrooms and his daily walk-throughs to review the continual work progress.
