On a motion made by Mrs. D'Amico, seconded by Mr. Giordano, pursuant to the aforementioned Executive Order, the Board suspended the public participation portion of the meeting and therefore, accordingly, there would be no public participation at this Board meeting.

Pledge of Allegiance Mr. Goldberg continued, stating that the Board of Education was interested in encouraging members of the public to share their ideas, comments and questions. Feedback and questions should be directed to the Board's email account at boe@farmingdaleschools.org. Questions and comments would be responded to by members of the central administrative team and would be publicly reviewed at the next regular Board meeting. Mr. Goldberg thanked everyone for their anticipated courtesy and cooperation. The meeting began with the Pledge of Allegiance.

# Superintendent's Update

Board of Education President Michael Goldberg asked Superintendent of Monthly Schools Paul Defendini for his update. Mr. Defendini began his monthly report Report stating that at the June Board of Education meeting, the Board takes a few moments to recognize the service of the members of the retiring Farmingdale Board **Recognition-**Family. This year, that recognition would be adjusted in light of the virtual Retirees format of our meetings during the New York Pause of COVID-19. Mr. Defendini stated that it was the central office administrative team's honor to congratulate each of the new retirees. Each administrator recognized teachers, clerical staff, custodial staff, teacher aides, school monitors and registered nurses who are leaving us in June to pursue their next adventure. A video clip was shown. The Board of Education thanked each staff member and wished them a long, healthy and happy retirement.

2020/21 Superintendent of Schools Defendini introduced Assistant to the Superintendent for Business Michael Motisi, who provided an overview of the status of the 2020-2021 budget as we head into the vote and election. Subsequent to this meeting, a new Executive Order was issued by Governor Cuomo that extended the receipt of the absentee ballots to June 16 at 5:00 p.m. The budget vote and election results would be tallied on the evening of June 16. Mr. Motisi reminded the Board of Education that a lock box would be available for receipt of ballots on Monday, June 8 and Tuesday, June 9 from

8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. at the main entrance of the Howitt Middle School on Van Cott Avenue.

Mr. Motisi provided an overview of the budget development work. He stated that this budget was focused on maintaining programs and allowing for updates for maintenance projects that provide for a safe and secure environment for students and staff. The budget increase was below the allowable tax tap and was less than the original version. Mr. Motisi stated that state and/or federal aid was still unknown. Mr. Motisi detailed each of the four propositions that were included on the ballot, the Board of Education trustee election and the Library Board of Trustee election.

Superintendent Defendini stated that many questions were coming in from the community related to the budget development. He recommended that residents take a look at the flipgrid presentations that had been posted on the district's website (www.farmingdaleschools.org), which categorized the types of common information threads with detailed explanations. He stated that the budget was developed with an eye towards keeping Farmingdale -Farmingdale. He emphasized that there are many programs that are important to our students and those have remained intact with this budget, whether it is electives, additional academic support, clubs, sports and other activities. Students in our community have a wide range of opportunities available to them and the Board of Education felt that it was important to maintain those choices. Reductions were made in non-essential expenditures, including updated lockers and playgrounds. The central administration believes that students sacrificed a great deal during the New York Pause, and it is important to get back to our primary mission. Questions were raised about savings during the closings. Mr. Defendini stated that while the buildings may have been closed, the programs and services continued in an uninterrupted fashion. Some extra-curricular clubs continued in a virtual format; instruction certainly continued. There were small savings in the transportation costs.

Questions were raised about the return to school and the district's reopening and reentry plan. Mr. Defendini stated that a thought-exchange questionnaire would be circulated to hear the voice of the community, the staff, students and their parents as to what we need to focus on prior to September. Guidance is coming from the Governor and from the CDC, but it is the voice of our constituents that we need to hear.

Finally, Mr. Defendini detailed the work associated with the actual budget vote and election. He stated that the counting of the ballots would begin at 5:00 p.m. on the evening of June 16 (updated since this board meeting). Election inspectors would be situated in the gymnasium, cafeteria, Board Room and Conference Room at the Howitt Middle School. Ballot confidentiality would be maintained based on the procedures that have been put into place wherein envelopes are opened and ballots removed and separated prior to being handed off to the tallying teams. Ballot bundles would be counted and reconciled separately by two election inspectors. After each ballot is counted and accounted for, a final tally will be determined by the District Clerk and the Board of Registration. The process will be live-streamed on the district's website throughout the evening. The Board President will provide the final results once every ballot is reviewed. Mr. Defendini extended his thanks to the Board of Registration, including Martha McWilliams, Joan McGarry and Arlene Taiclet and to the District Clerk for their efforts behind the scenes that will ensure an accurate process that focuses on the fidelity of the vote and the community's voice.

Board President Michael Goldberg asked the District Clerk if there was any Board correspondence Mrs. Rogers reported that the Board of Education has received several emails in the past weeks. The first is from a parent regarding the delivery of instruction during New York Pause. The building principal and a central office administrator responded on behalf of the Board of Education.

Three residents wrote of their concerns related to the 2020-2021 school budget. Mr. Motisi responded on behalf of the Board of Education. Attempts were made to reach one of the residents without success. In addition, the budget was reduced prior to its readoption to lower the tax levy. The concerns were also included in the superintendent's updates, which are posted on the district's website.

Finally, the Board received a letter of introduction from a candidate who is running for the New York State Assembly.

Board Committee Reports. Mr. Goldberg asked the trustees if they had any Committee Reports. Mr. Goldberg and Mrs. Soete both reported on the many year end activities that have been taking place that honor the students' work and achievements. Honor Society inductions have taken place; senior send-off parades, PTA installations, fifth grade and eighth grade ceremonies and field days have all been taking place and while they may look a little different than our traditional programs, the joy and celebrations have continued in a grand, extraordinary manner.

Mrs. Lively reported that the Policy Committee continues to meet to review changes that are the result of updated in law. She participated in the districtwide safety plan committee work. Mrs. Lively reported that the Farmingdale Youth Council budget that is included on the ballot does not include an increase from the previous 12 years' budgets. She explained that the Youth Council programs are dependent on the passing of the school budget as the fees associated with using the buildings under a contingent budget would result in very high expenditures. Mrs. Lively reported that the local Chamber of Commerce was continuing to meet in the virtual environment. She encouraged community members to support the local restaurants which, while not open in the usual manner, are providing curb side delivery.

Mr. Espinosa reported on the Republic Airport Commission, which will have a meeting in August, and the Library Board, which hopes to begin curbside delivery of books and other materials in the coming weeks.

**Draft Policy** Board President Michael Goldberg introduced Assistant Superintendent for Human Resources and Administration Glen Zakian and asked for the first and Regulation review of draft Policy Np. 8635, Information and Data Privacy Security, 8635, Breach and Notification. The original policy, which focused on data privacy, has been expanded by the Board of Regents during the past several months Information based on concerns related to security breaches in neighboring school districts and Data Privacy and the resultant ransom payments. The policy interconnects with the requirements of FERPA privacy regulations and provides for notification Security, **Breach and** protocols if our data systems are compromised. Dr. William Brennan spoke of Notification the district's adoption of the National Institute for Standards and Technology Cybersecurity Framework plan, the protection of personally identifiable information, the appointment of a data privacy officer and the use of industry

standard safeguards, encryption methodology, firewalls and password policies to prevent security breaches. Dr. Brennan outlined some of the changes that were immediately implemented districtwide. The policy also addresses third party contractor access to PII, their own plans for security protocols, district employee annual training, and limits to access of employee personal information.

Draft 2020-Assistant Superintendent Zakian continued with a discussion of Policy No. 2021 6306, the Districtwide School Safety Plan. Mr. Zakian stated that this plan is Districtwide reviewed and approved each year by the Board of Education. Stakeholders from across the district and community are included in the annual review and School Safety include, but are not limited to, members of the Board of Education, central Plan office administrators, police, fire, homeland security, teachers, support staff, transportation specialists, risk assessments officers and BOCES This year's exhaustive review was conducted during the representatives. shutdown and but was no less comprehensive. The draft plan will be posted on the district's website for thirty days to allow for community review and input. This policy will then be included in a future board agenda for approval.
