Mr. Goldberg thanked everyone for their anticipated courtesy and cooperation. The meeting began with the Pledge of Allegiance.

## Superintendent's Update

MonthlyBoard President Michael Goldberg introduced Superintendent of School PaulUpdateDefendini and asked for his monthly update.Mr. Defendini began with the<br/>announcement that the Board of Education meetings would resume in person at the<br/>June 2 meeting. It is anticipated that this public meeting would take place in the Howitt<br/>East gymnasium. Information would be provided on the district's website.

Mr. Defendini noted that with tonight's approval of the Superintendent's Report, a new structure would be in place at the central office Superintendent Cabinet level. With the retirement of Dr. Joan Ripley in January, a realignment of responsibilities would be in place beginning with July 1, 2021. Dr. Ripley would continue to oversee the Pupil Personnel Services programs, including Special Education, Speech and Psychology Services. In addition, the Guidance and Social Work departments would be under her umbrella of responsibilities. We believe that the focus on students' social and emotional wellness, particularly as we come to the end of this pandemic would be of vital importance. Dr. Olsen will transition to the position of Assistant Superintendent for Curriculum and Instruction, overseeing all curricular departments K-12.

Mr. Defendini was pleased to report on changes at the schools as the lifting of some of the protocols we have used throughout this past school year are no longer required or recommended. Specifically, temperatures would no longer be taken at the doors upon entrance each morning; zero period classes have returned for Jazz and other bands. Art, Library, Innovation Lab and Music have returned to their classrooms. Quarantine protocols are being adjusted as per the guidance provided to us by the New York State Department of Health. Spring sports have returned; we have loosened the screenings for athletes.

Federal grant funding information is beginning to be provided to the districts. Specific information will be provided at the June 2 meeting.

Mr. Defendini noted that there would be a summer program this year and that the Farmingdale Youth Council would be providing a modified program.

Year-end celebrations continue to be refined as we get more information from the state about social distancing and the changes in the limitations we have had during this past year. Information will be provided by the school principals as we get closer to the end of the school year.

Mr. Defendini noted that there are some unusual scheduling changes to the last two weeks of school, particularly at the middle school and high school level. Regents exams will be different this year; June 18 and June 21 will be instructional days, not examination days.

Finally, Mr. Defendini wanted to remind residents that the Budget Vote and Election would take place from 6:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. on Tuesday, May 18 in the Howitt West gymnasium.

Mr. Goldberg asked Mr. Defendini for an update on the pool complex. Mr. Defendini stated that photographs would be posted on the district website soon. He reported that once the steel had been delivered, the progress became most notable. The roof on both structures would be installed and then the masonry and carpenters would get to work on the interior and the installation of the window systems.
